Today (March 25th) was a good day for a couple Schipperke pups in Camrose. Majekin's Fusion with Jet went Winners dog (6 - 9 pup) and his littermate Jet's Faux Pas V Majekin (6 - 9 pup) went Best of winners. One of the other dogs competing was Jr pup female - Majekin Be My Nemesis -shown/owned by her 15 year old handler, and both first time in the ring. We had a large entry (for Schips) of 3 - 4 - 2 and all had a wonderful time showing.

Winners male - Majekin Fusion's With Jet - got 1 pt Winners female, BW - Jet's Faux Paw V Majekin BB and **Group 1**!!! - Ch Maheekun's Majic Dancer Just found out that Jet Majekin Fancypants Kashuba, the other littermate to my Sean and sister Roxy, won a group 4th and Best puppy in Group and **Best Puppy** in Show.

All 3 pups were bred by myself and Susan Woodliffe out of Ch Marpeg's Beelzebub at Jet (Bubba) and Ch Jet's Dark Cloud V Majekin (Nimbus).

Way to go to owner Judy Kashuba of Thunder Bay.

A couple of new Schipperke Champions in the April 7-8 weekend in Red Deer. New Ch Jet's Faux Paw V Majekin - Jr puppy, 4 times in the ring -. 


In my masters arms, Snuggly and tight





2007 SCC National Specialty report

The 2007 National is over and what a success it was!! We did have one major glitch, as the judge originally scheduled – Mr. Sonny Ambrosio – was unable to attend due to illness. He became ill on the plane to Edmonton so we had Mr. Bud Haverstock, previous CKC Director for Alberta and all breed judge preside. Results are posted on the SCC website.

For the sweeps classes, Ms. Kristen Henry of Bonchien presided over the puppies and veterans. In her words "the veterans were outstanding, but the puppies are even better – the breed is in good hands".

Putting on a National of this size is a lot of work. Many, many hours go into the organizing and planning – more than a year in advance. Trophies/prizes have to be decided on, premium lists have to be created and sent out, catalogues have to be done, ring stewards have to be engaged and hundreds of other little things that come up. When deciding on trophies and prizes, donations are needed to pay for these. So a call goes out requesting people to sponsor various classes. This year, the donations were very generous from SCC members and non members, especially through some friends in the US. Thank you to all who donated. The prizes were very unique this year – handcrafted, painted glass pictures of schips made by Susan Woodliffe, our resident artist. Susan also made pottery schip brooches for each exhibitor. Sharon Dodd in Oklahoma made me schip magnets of the Club logo, and other ones to go to the welcome package for our exhibitors, thanks to her for the generous gift. Charlie had the plaques made up and brought the rosettes out from Surrey. Thank you Charlie, that saved the shipping cost. Charlie also oversaw the silent auction which was very successful and will be reported on the financial report.

Special awards of recognition were created by myself and given to Marg Street and Joan Federow for their long time contribution to Schipperkes in Canada. These were accepted on their behalf by Peggy Flesher (Marpeg) and Charlie Veillon.

We had a catered lunch graciously catered by John Wichuk, a new SCC member. Tremendous thanks to John for buying the food, doing all the preparing and bringing it to the show site. There was a lot of food leftover, and this was taken by Susan Woodliffe to one of the inner city schools and distributed to the children in need. Anita Jensen and Donalda Cassils helped out with whatever was needed during the day, much gratitude to them also.

Our rings stewards did a great job in keeping things flowing smoothly.

Unfortunately due to camera issues, we do not have a video of the specialty. Perhaps in future we might find someone who is more experienced in this area.

I think everyone enjoyed the Specialty and the chance to see so many Schipperkes in the ring all at one time. There are still some catalogues available on a first come first serve basis. These would be worthwhile having as the photos are excellent in the ads, and the printer did a marvelous job. 30 hours went into doing the catalogue alone – not an easy task but worth the effort.

Best of luck to those who do future Specialties and if you require any assistance feel free to call on me. Planning is the key – and many hours of your time to have it come off well. Write down all the things that need to be done on the day, make a list for your ring steward as to what awards go with what rosette, and double check everything and hope for the best. One thing we did add this year was thank you cards to those who donated and sponsored a class. These were addressed so the winners could add their personal note and mail off to the sponsor. It is hoped that this was done. It is nice to say thank you as we need sponsors to put on a specialty.

HOT DOG...

10 Minutes to DISASTER

If it's hot, your pet may be in trouble!

During warm weather, pet owners must take precautions against the danger of heat exhaustion and heatstroke for their pets. The temperature in a parked car, even in the shade with the windows partly open, can rapidly reach a level that will seriously harm or even kill your pet.



Dogs cool themselves by panting and by releasing heat through their paws. On summer days, the air and upholstery in your vehicle that can heat up to high temperatures that make it impossible for pets to cool

themselves. Your dog will be more comfortable if left at home...

Heatstroke symptoms include:

Exaggerated panting (or the sudden stopping of panting), rapid or erratic pulse; salivation; anxious or staring expression; weakness and muscle tremors; lack of coordination; tongue and lips red (which may eventually turn bluish in color); convulsions or vomiting; collapse, coma and death...



If your dog shows symptoms of heatstroke, follow these instruction:



- Immediately move the animal to a cool, shady place
- Wet the dog with cool (not cold) water
- Fan vigorously to promote evaporation. This process will cool the blood, which reduces the dog's core temperature
- Do not apply ice. This constrict blood flow which will inhibit cooling
- Allow the dog to drink some cool water (or to lick ice cream if no water is available
- Take the dog to a veterinarian as soon as possible for further treatment.

Veterinarians may apply supportive measures such as intravenous fluids to rehydrate the animal and oxygen to prevent brain damage
