### Seamus R. Thompson Remembered

Camplaren's Proud Pal, better known to the world as Seamus R. Thompson, made the journey to Rainbow Bridge on September 10, after a slow health decline that took a sharp down-turn in his last week. Seamus is survived by humans Doug, Jaqui and Paige Thompson, and Oma, and Schipperke Darla.

Seamus has left us with a number of important legacies.

He saw the world as a place of abundance. There was not a trace of competitiveness or jealousy in his character. You could take away his supper, and he would know he would get it back. Another dog could eat his supper and he knew there would be more. You could give all the attention to the baby and he knew there would be attention for him at the end of the day. At story time he would position himself within foot's reach for a back scratch. He did not mind sharing our attention. He was happy to share anything.

Loyalty, patience, unconditional love, and compassion were all qualities that Seamus will be remembered for. You could carry him around, dress him up, let visiting puppies chase and climb on him, take his toy away, move his blanket to a different spot every day, and he wouldn't be bothered. If he did reach his limit, he would seek a retreat rather than get cranky. He was extraordinarily tolerant.

He will be remembered by some for his humour and quirky was of looking at the world. This part of Seamus is not lost. He used Jaqui as his medium on Earth to transcribe his summary of the family's year, and he will continue to do this from Rainbow Bridge. So while Seamus may no longer be living physically, we will never consider him gone.

She will not go quietly, this dog who shared my life In subtle ways she lets me know her spirit still survives.


Old habits still make me think I hear a scratching at the door. Or step back when I drop a morsel on the floor.
